



Treaty on Formal Relations

The signatory nations of this treaty, seeking to preserve peace in the international community, champion policies of constitutional rights, defend their sovereignty and rights, and cooperate diplomatically and economically, do agree to all of the following terms.

ARTICLE 1

The nations in communion with this treaty seek to:

- Preserve peace in the international community
- Champion a policy of rights for all those protected by the nations' Constitutions
- Defend their homeland, rights and safety at all costs

ARTICLE 2

Each nation shall publicly respect the official policies of the other, and shall each work for the greater good of the international community.

ARTICLE 3

Each party recognizes the sovereignty and territorial integrity of the other. If either party violates this recognition by encouraging the secession of a portion of the other party, waging war upon the other, or by some other means, this treaty shall be rendered null and void.

ARTICLE 4

No barrier to free trade between the signatory nations shall be established. If either party institutes such a barrier, this treaty shall be rendered null and void.

ARTICLE 5

A contracting party may withdraw from this alliance at any time, under the following terms and conditions:

The withdrawing party shall provide a full twenty-four hour warning before withdrawing from the alliance. The terminating party shall meet with representatives of the other contracting party to discuss grievances and attempt to negotiate an agreement to salvage the treaty at least once during this period.

ARTICLE 6

The parties of this treaty will resolve any disputes between them by peaceful, diplomatic means.

ARTICLE 7

Each party has the right to construct an embassy, consulate, or other such diplomatic mission within the territory of the other, to be maintained by the party that establishes such mission.

ARTICLE 8

This treaty may be amended as required by consensus of the signatory nations. The present pact shall come into effect immediately upon signature and shall remain in force for a period of one year to the date. At the proper time before expiration of said term, the contracting parties shall at the request of either enter into negotiations for the renewal of the treaty.
